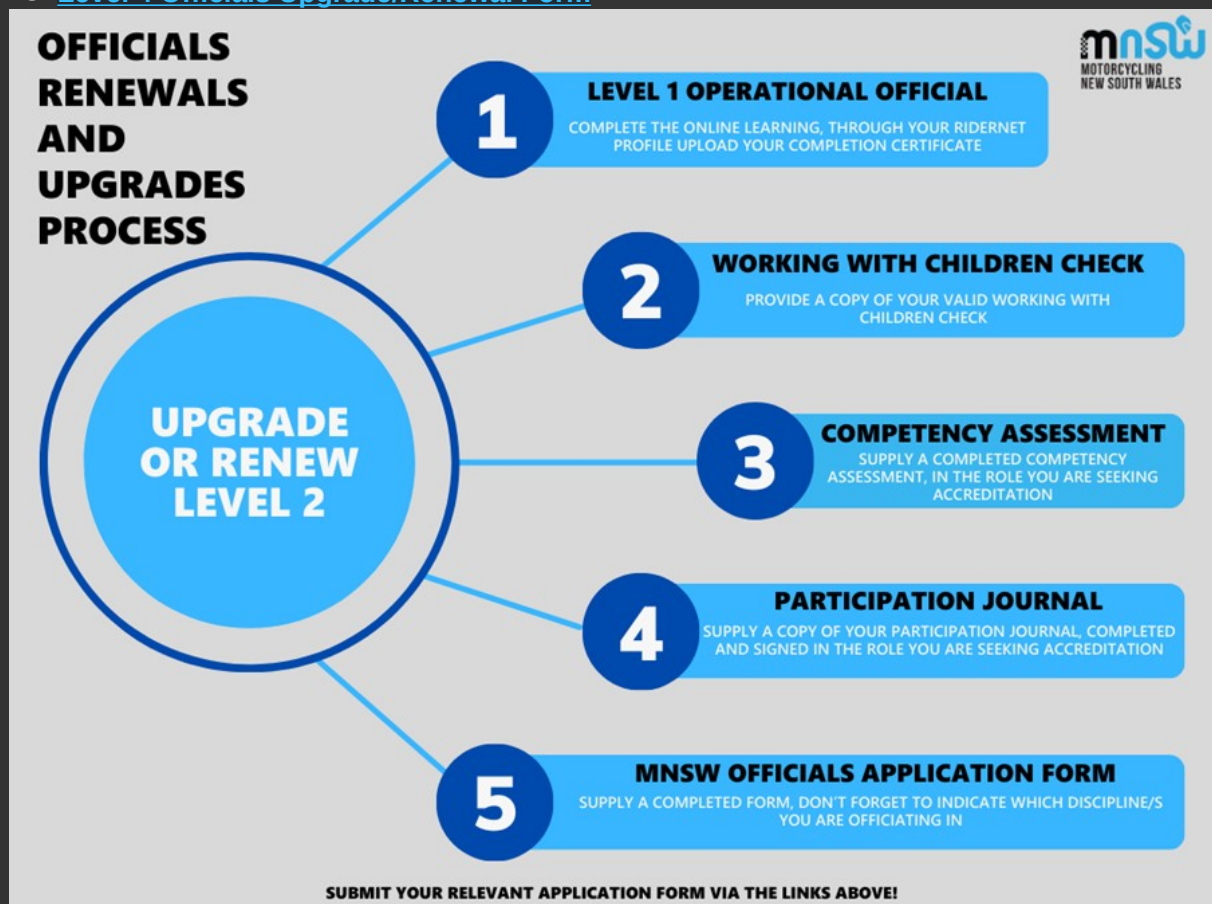
Officials Upgrades & Renewals – Follow the Right Process to Avoid Disappointment

Moving forward MNSW will be utilising an online form for all official applications, Trainee through to Level 4, the process is simple and easy to navigate, with all applicants now able to “drag and drop” PDF files into the online form. This will streamline the process and eliminate the need to email your documents.

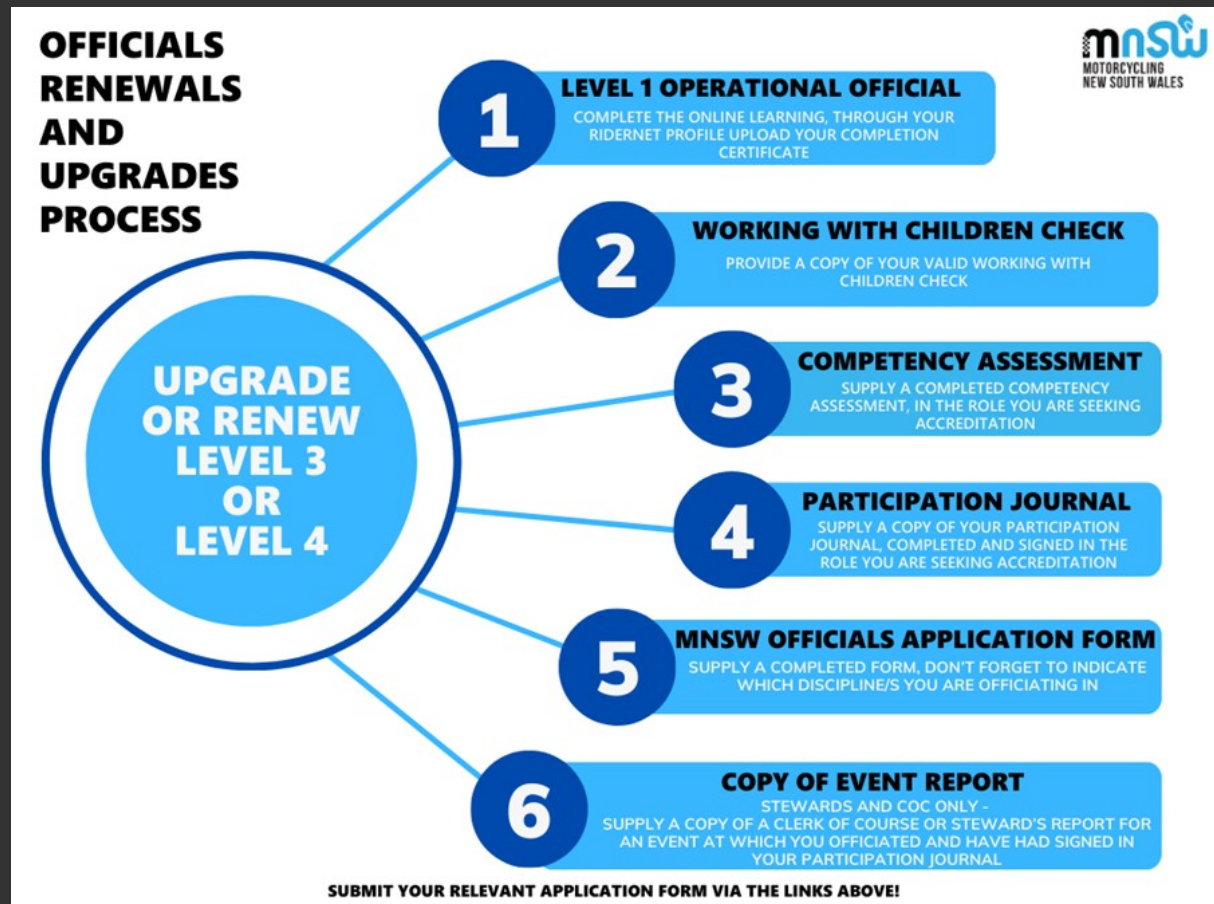


In addition to this, we have made some flowcharts to outline exactly what is needed to upgrade/renew an accreditation, you can also find these on our “Officials” website page.
